14. General Summary of Function/Purpose of Position

This position serves as a senior Fire Safety Inspector ensuring that medical and adult use (recreational) marijuana facilities and businesses located in the state are in compliance with the applicable fire safety codes, standards and various state laws, rules, and regulations. This position primarily works with the Marijuana Regulatory Agency (MRA), and is responsible for inspections of the most complex medical and adult use marijuana facilities statewide. This position may be asked to assist the Bureau of Fire Services inspect other state-regulated facilities, institutions, consumer fireworks facilities and businesses as needed.

Duty 1

General Summary:

Percentage: 85

Conduct complex inspections of medical and adult use marijuana facilities to ensure compliance with state fire safety laws and rules. Investigate complex fires and complaints of possible hazards or violations in accordance with applicable fire safety laws and rules.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Perform complex pre-licensure and post-licensure inspections of marijuana facilities.
- Investigates complex complaints of possible fire hazards and code violations.
- Prepare inspection and investigation reports, citing appropriate violations of laws and rules, within established or mandated time frames.
- Perform bi-annual inspections as required per the marijuana licensing requirements and assign
- Identify and advise facility management of code violations and recommend corrective action.
- Provides instructions and training to less senior staff on the proper methods & processes necessary to conduct inspecting of marijuana facilities.
- Other duties as assigned.

Duty 2

General Summary:

Percentage: 5

Review complex construction plans of new and existing structures or marijuana facilities regulated by the BFS and/or MRA to determine compliance with applicable state fire safety laws and rules.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Review complex marijuana facility plans in support of MRA applications section as needed.
- Provide technical assistance to architects, engineers, and facility providers regarding compliance with applicable fire safety laws and rules.
- Verify local fire department approval of plans.
- Identify and document deficiencies and prepare related report.

Duty 3

General Summary:

Percentage: 5

Conduct complex investigations of complaints filed with LARA/BFS/MRA against license marijuana facilities.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Conduct complaint investigations.
- Prepare appropriate reports to document findings.
- Provide technical assistance to prosecutors and applicable licensing agencies bringing action against
- marijuana facility owners cited to be in violation of the applicable fire safety laws and rules.
- Testify at hearings and court proceedings on matters related to findings of inspections.

Duty 4

General Summary:

Percentage: 5

Conduct and participate in fire safety training sessions and seminars.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Prepare and present fire safety information as requested by bureau management to marijuana industry representatives or others as it relates to the state fire safety rules.
- Provide fire safety training to private and governmental agencies regarding Marijuana facilities.
- Answer routine and complex questions regarding the subject matter and conduct necessary follow-up.

16. Describe the types of decisions made independently in this position and tell who or what is affected by those decisions.

Violations cited during inspections and investigations, and compliance issues identified. Determining the immediacy of corrective action. Prioritizing and scheduling daily inspections. Facility owners, the general public, architects and engineers are affected by these decisions.

17. Describe the types of decisions that require the supervisor's review.

Any policy or procedural issues of a sensitive nature. Priority of inspections or investigations in extreme situations.

18. What kind of physical effort is used to perform this job? What environmental conditions in this position physically exposed to on the job? Indicate the amount of time and intensity of each activity and condition. Refer to instructions.

Extensive walking, bending, and reaching during inspections and significant amount of time operating a motor vehicle/traveling throughout the state. Exposure to health care risks, hazardous conditions, extended time in confined areas, and weather-related elements at construction sites, marijuana facilities, health care facilities, and penal institutions.

This position is responsible for conducting fire safety inspections and investigations.

EDUCATION:

Fire Safety Inspector 9: Educational level typically acquired through completion of high school.

Fire Safety Inspector E10 and 11: Educational level typically acquired through completion of high school and successful completion of courses or continuing education credits for the Michigan Certified Fire Inspector program or National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Certified Inspector I credentials.

EXPERIENCE:

Fire Safety Inspector 11

Three years of experience equivalent to a Fire Safety Inspector, including one year equivalent to a Fire Safety Inspector E10.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Thorough knowledge of state fire safety laws and rules and the ability to appropriately interpret and apply them. The ability to communicate effectively verbally and in writing and maintain favorable public relations while representing the department. Ability to use a personal computer and some knowledge of word processing software.

Possession of a valid Michigan driver's license.

Continuing certification as a Michigan Department of Licensing & Regulatory Affairs Fire Inspector.
