14. General Summary of Function/Purpose of Position

This position is a member of the Quality Assurance and Technical Development team in the Forensic Science Division and serves as the Breath Alcohol Technical Leader. This position is responsible for managing the technical operations of the Breath Alcohol discipline within the Forensic Science Division on a statewide basis. For the Breath Alcohol discipline, the position ensures compliance with accreditation standards, distributes and reviews proficiency tests, ensures appropriate audits are conducted, maintains the current procedure and training manuals, designs, directs, and conducts developmental research, coordinates training, oversees the quality assurance measures of the discipline, testifies in court as needed, and assists with special projects. This position must perform all duties in a bias free manner.

Duty 1:

General Summary of Duty 1 65 % of Time

Provides statewide coordination and ultimate technical expertise for all activities within the Breath Alcohol discipline.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

Responsible for monitoring, reporting, and resolving any potential quality problems with calibration and testing, and recommending preventive measures to improve the overall quality system. Identifies, procures, administers, evaluates, and retains all proficiency and competency tests performed within the discipline. This includes compliance with national standards and accreditation requirements.

Formulates and implements new procedures, policies, and guidelines for the testing and calibration activities of the Breath Alcohol program. Continually evaluates and updates all policies and procedures related to Breath Alcohol testing and calibration to ensure continued compliance with accreditation standards and national guidelines. Interacts with staff to standardize training materials and calibration results.

Creates training plans and content for those providing training to Datamaster users. Coordinates the content of training programs for Datamaster users to be delivered by the Training Division. This position is responsible for the review and acceptance of training records for all new employees and has the authority to declare competency in Breath Alcohol testing and calibration prior to commencement of training and calibration activities. Evaluate and recommend continuing education programs for employees to develop the competencies necessary for success as a trainer and calibration resource. Provides guidance and instruction during expert witness seminars.

Evaluates employee technical performance and designs and implements remediation programs for poor performing employees. Consults with the Training Division regarding the expected level of technical competence, including consultation regarding disciplinary actions, up to and including termination.

Recognize, discuss, and take action to react to new risks and opportunities that are frequently introduced in the technical, judicial, and administrative area of the Breath Alcohol program.

Provide input on the statewide procurement and maintenance of analytical equipment, including the establishment of contracts for the purposes of equipment acquisition and maintenance contracts within the Breath Alcohol program to ensure compliance with respective accreditation standards.

Provides technical expertise for the Breath Alcohol program and consults with law enforcement agencies regarding the Breath Alcohol program.

Duty 2:

General Summary of Duty 2 10 % of Time

As the subject matter expert, provides legislative and judicial assistance on matters pertaining to Breath Alcohol, which includes monitoring and responding to relevant court challenges, providing expert witness testimony, and consulting on legislative and legal issues.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

Provides legislative support and knowledge to the department and division regarding current and pending state and federal legislation affecting the Breath Alcohol program. This may include presentation of material, training, and attendance at meetings, including testimony to judiciary committees.

May testify as a qualified expert witness in all levels of state and federal courts. Provides testimony on accreditation, training and calibration activities related to the Breath Alcohol program, including quality assurance measures, training programs, and analytical procedures. Consults with prosecutors and other criminal justice officials preparing cases for court. Monitors and critiques expert witness testimony of scientists testifying in the area of Breath Alcohol.

Monitors and responds to Daubert challenges, discovery orders, court orders, and other judicial related inquiries in the area of Breath Alcohol. Provides assistance and guidance to scientists in legal and judicial matters.

Oversees Administrative Rules relating to Breath Alcohol. Ensures that any promulgated rules are correct and current and develops or re-writes when necessary.

As needed, provides guidance and support to the department and division regarding any court-related issue statewide.

Duty 3:

General Summary of Duty 3 10 % of Time

Provides program outreach to all parties in the criminal justice community including but not limited to judges, prosecutors and court administrators.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

Assist with the training outreach programs designed by the Forensic Science Division Director and Training Division Director.

Design and develop training materials and programs for use by the criminal justice community. Coordinates and directs training programs for law enforcement, service groups, and academic institutions.

Provides guidance and instruction during expert witness seminars.

Duty 4:

General Summary of Duty 4 10 % of Time

Coordinates and conducts research in the area of Breath Alcohol testing and calibration activities for the purposes of protocol development and continued advancement of the science.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

Coordinates and conducts research in the area of Breath Alcohol for the purposes of protocol development and continued advancement of the science. Interacts with the scientific community for the exchange of information. Authors and presents technical papers before groups at seminars and meetings.

Maintain presence and/or seek opportunities for participation on national committees in area of expertise.

Duty 5:

General Summary of Duty 5 5 % of Time

Completes special projects on behalf of the Division Director.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

Performs duties associated with special projects and manages activities assigned by Division within the forensic Breath Alcohol program. Generates and maintains statistical reports or other assignments as divisional or departmental issues demand.

Identifies external sources of funding for Breath Alcohol. Assists in the preparation of grant applications, monitors progress of project, and prepares status reports as needed.

The position is responsible for serving as the statewide overseer who ensures compliance with accreditation standards, training, proficiency testing, procedure development, and equipment procurement. The position handles legislative and judicial issues related to Breath Alcoholy including providing legislative support, expert witness testimony, and monitoring and responding to relevant court challenges. The position also assists with outreach programs to provide training to the criminal justice community, conducts scientific research, and completes other special assignments.

Direct supervision of unit employees and routine completion of casework has been removed to increase time for statewide oversight of the Breath Alcohol discipline, handling of legislative and judicial issues, conducting outreach programs, performing research, and completing special projects.

The work area function is to perform analytical testing and manage a calibration program for Breath Alcohol analysis. This position is responsible for providing the ultimate technical expertise for all activities in the statewide service area of Breath Alcohol, including the development, oversight, and standardization of all policies and procedures.
