14. General Summary of Function/Purpose of Position

Responsible for delivering environmental education programming for fourth graders at up to four assigned regional locations and through virtual video conferencing platforms. The interpreter will also mentor and lead seasonal Nature Awaits Program staff at assigned park sites. The interpreter will identify interpretive program needs at each of the assigned locations, both for the current program and long-range planning.

The position will likely include a state vehicle for use: however, The Nature Awaits Interpreter may be required to provide their own transportation for site visits with the DNR paying mileage and meal reimbursements consistent with State of Michigan guidelines.

The Nature Awaits Interpreter is a limited term position (Until September 30, 2026) that reports to the Southern Interpretive Field Manager.

Duty 1

General Summary of Duty 1 % of Time 60

Responsible for the delivery of interpretive programs and for mentoring and leading work of seasonal Nature Guides.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

- Responsible for delivering interpretive programs to fourth graders at the state parks and over virtual video conferencing platforms.
- Responsible for ensuring Nature Awaits Program Staff is aware of their daily work assignment and making sure interpretive teams get to the proper park location for the day.
- Responsible for contacting teachers participating in the Nature Awaits program to confirm attendance and to give instructions.
- Responsible for mentoring and coaching Nature Awaits Interpreters on interpretive techniques, resource questions, and DNR objectives and messages.
- Responsible for communicating with the Nature Awaits Program Coordinator any issues that require attention, the progress at each site toward meeting program objectives, and other issues as needed.
- Responsible for meeting with Park Supervisors, Hatchery Interpreter and Hatchery Manager as necessary to determine issues that need to be addressed to ensure a successful program.
- Communicating with administrators, teachers and students from rural and urban areas.

Duty 2

Responsible for assisting with training of seasonal Nature Awaits Program interpretive staff.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

- Responsible for fulfillment of assigned duties in the planning and implementation of pre-season training for seasonal interpretive staff hired by DNR to provide fourth grade interpretive programs in state parks. This may include leading or assisting in training sessions, preparation of instructional materials, coaching break-out groups, serving as a moderator on discussions, demonstrating interpretive techniques, etc.
- Responsible for any follow-up training of Nature Awaits Educators throughout the season. This may include staff that did not attend the general training sessions, or staff that needs assistance developing or strengthening particular job skills.
- Occasionally Nature Awaits Program interpretive staff will be hired later in the season. The Interpreter will be responsible for assisting with on-site training to prepare said staff with appropriate skills and equipment needed to perform job duties independently.
- Help to interview and select Nature Awaits State Workers.

Duty 3

Responsible for collecting and maintaining records and reports prepared by the seasonal Nature Awaits Program interpretive staff necessary for program evaluation, budget development and annual comparisons and for evaluating program effectiveness at assigned sites.

Individual tasks related to the duty.

- Monitor the preparation and filing of weekly attendance and activity reports, including review for accuracy and clarity. Submit reports as requested to Nature Awaits Program Coordinator.
- Conduct periodic checks and end of season inventory on assigned resource kits and transport kits to storage. Submit completed inventories to Nature Awaits Program Coordinator.
- Collect evaluations from program participants and compile data into spreadsheet.
- Evaluation of programs and services offered at assigned sites and the preparation of recommendations on program content, both for the current year and long-term plans.
- Implement a report card or other evaluation tool to measure program effectiveness at assigned sites.
- Develop recommendations for mid-year program changes to be communicated to Nature Awaits Program Coordinator.
- Develop recommendations for future year program changes to be incorporated into annual report.

The Nature Awaits Interpreter will study each seasonal interpreter's delivery technique and program content, and will coach the employee on teaching strategies, group management skills, dealing with difficult visitors, talking to different audiences (age, background experience, interest level), delivery of department messages, program leadership practices, etc). The Nature Awaits Interpreter will also determine the best and most practical way to solve issues at parks brought to them by a Nature Awaits Educator or Park Supervisor.

It is a seasonal interpretive-education program designed to teach fourth grade students about the unique natural and cultural resources found in each state park, and the importance of being stewards of these resources. Audiences include both children and adults, often in an outdoor classroom setting.
	The Nature Awaits Program is managed by the Education Services Section of the DNR Marketing & Outreach Division in cooperation with Parks & Recreation Division.
