It requires advanced training in comprehensive psychological assessment and treatment/interventions. Responsibilities, in a learning capacity, include psychological testing, provision of individual, group and family therapy, development of behavioral treatment plans and active functioning within a multidisciplinary team setting.

Duty 1

General Summary:

Percentage: 30

Supervised Comprehensive Psychological Assessment

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Administration, scoring, and interpretation of psychological tests
- Written report of test results
- Oral report of test results to treatment team members and others o Interns will perform formal psychological test batteries on children and adolescents presenting in an inpatient setting. o Interns will use the DSM-IV to generate diagnostic formulations. o Interns will participate in supervision and seminars devoted to assessment issues that will also periodically involve presentation of diagnostic evaluations and ongoing case material in team conferences.

Duty 2

General Summary:

Percentage: 40

Supervised provision of psychotherapy and treatment in an inpatient child and adolescent psychiatric hospital setting.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Individual Psychotherapy
- Group Therapy
- Family Therapy o Intern will share a diverse caseload of five to eight patients with their assigned supervisor. o Intern will conduct individual and group psychotherapy with children and adolescents in inpatient treatment with groups varying by age, gender, and presenting problems. o Intern will identify intervention techniques that are uniquely promising with high-risk, diagnostically complex children, adolescents, and families. o Intern will apply family systems theories and techniques to their work with the families of children and adolescents in an inpatient setting. o Interns will apply either manual based child management training or a hybridization of various techniques in providing child management training to parents. o Interns will participate in supervision focusing on individual psychotherapy, group, and family therapy. o Intern will participate in planning conferences with an inter-disciplinary team comprising psychology, psychiatry, social work, nursing, special education, community mental health, and social service agency. o Interns will maintain regular communication and consultation to professionals and agencies involved in the continuum of care in order to facilitate person-centered treatment and discharge planning.

Duty 3

General Summary:

Percentage: 15

Active participation in all required trainings and seminars.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Interns will discuss ethical and professional issues pertaining to their internship activities in supervision. o Intern will obtain certification in Trauma Focused-Cognitive Behavioral Therapy o Intern will participate in seminars, conferences, and a Journal Club in which professional literature is applied to clinical practice with challenging patient populations. o Intern will utilize Medical Library and on-line resources to investigate the empirical bases of clinical interventions. o Intern will present findings in seminars and/or case conferences. o Intern will participate in Psychology Departmental staff meetings.

Duty 4

General Summary:

Percentage: 13

Supervised Milieu and Behavioral Consultation/Intervention

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Intern will consult with interdisciplinary living area teams regarding milieu interventions for their assigned patients. o Intern will attend weekly living area team meetings focusing on milieu treatment issues. o Intern will develop behavioral treatment plans in consultation with treatment team members when indicated. o Intern will receive training in Safety-Care Intervention and will apply this training to help defuse crisis situations in the milieu. o Intern will receive daily supervision in milieu issues from their psychology supervisor as well as from the living area psychiatrist on the unit to which they are assigned.

Duty 5

General Summary:

Percentage: 2

Hospital organization medical record keeping requirements.

Individual tasks related to the duty:

- Intern will follow administrative procedures and requirements regarding organizing work, setting priorities, and completing paperwork per Hospital and Psychology Departmental policies.

The student intern in this position will be supervised by a staff psychologist. The student may make process decisions such as when and where to render psychological assessment or therapy.
