14. General Summary of Function/Purpose of Position

Under the direction of the crew leader, this position installs and removes traffic control devices for bridge inspection and maintenance tasks; participates in bridge repair and maintenance tasks; ensures job site safety and security; performs basic maintenance on vehicles and equipment; and operates specialized equipment. Completes annual and periodic preinspection safety cleaning of bridges. This position requires participation in the Transportation Maintenance Worker (TMW) work element program.

This position requires statewide travel and the ability to respond to emergency situations on a 24/7 basis.

15. Please describe the assigned duties, percent of time spent performing each duty, and what is done to complete each duty. List the duties from most important to least important. The total percentage of all duties performed must equal 100 percent. Duty 1 General Summary: 80 Percentage: Travel statewide, assist with installing and removing traffic control devices for bridge inspection and maintenance tasks and participate in bridge repair and bridge maintenance activities (i.e. deck blow out). Individual tasks related to the duty: Set up traffic control and lane closures at the job site for adherence to MDOT's Mobility Policy, proper work zone • safety, and prescribed standards. Work as a team to ensure proper work zone coverage and safety awareness. Operate crew cab truck with arrow trailer, ability to back up vehicle with trailer. • Operate hand tools (scalers, small air hammers, chain saws, epoxy injection machines, and air operated grinding tools). Participate in washing bridges using 1 inch hose with up to 100 psi pressure washing debris off the steel structure • and often includes the ability to drive a water tanker. Assist with decent control training by cleaning up ropes. • Demonstrate a strong commitment to safety including wearing the proper personal protective equipment (PPE) and • adhering to MDOT safety standards when performing all duties. Ensure equipment is locked down nightly. Assist in the emergency repair of bridges (i.e. concrete replacement) when required. • Duty 2 General Summary: Percentage: 5 Perform routine maintenance on specialized bridge inspection vehicles and maintenance equipment. Individual tasks related to the duty: Perform minor repairs and routine maintenance to Reach all. • Perform minor repairs and routine maintenance on other specialized equipment such as arrow boards, trailers, • water trucks and light towers. Record vehicle information for daily inspection reports and logs. • Duty 3 General Summary: Percentage: 5 Assist various region crews on bridge maintenance operations as required. Individual tasks related to the duty: Assist in the repair of bridge joints and decks using hand and power tools (i.e. scalers, small air hammers, chain • saws, epoxy injection machines, and air operated grinding tools). Assist with deck blow outs. . Level concrete and perform other physical labor. Duty 4 General Summary: Percentage: 5 Operate specialized equipment. Individual tasks related to the duty: Operate bucket, scissor lift, and reach all trucks. Perform other duties related to structure maintenance as requested. Dutv 5 General Summary: Percentage: 5 Other duties assigned. Individual tasks related to the duty: Assist in the fabrication and installation of overhead signs during periods of the year when bridge inspection and maintenance are slow.

• Other duties as assigned.

Decide if the weather or road conditions are a hazard and remove traffic control devices if applicable.

Identify proper traffic control layout for proposed work.

Changes in schedule or procedures.

Physical ability to move traffic control equipment, stand, and walk in outdoor temperatures for long periods of time. Climbing in and out of under bridge bucket, climbing on piers when required, and using ladders safely. Working in heavy high-speed traffic situations. Working at heights up to 150' utilizing aerial equipment. Operating 60-pound jack hammers. Lifting and carrying of heavy tools and equipment up to 100 lbs. Working around hazardous materials. Work outdoors in adverse weather conditions. Statewide travel and the ability to respond to emergency situations on a 24/7 basis. Must comply with Guidance Document 10118 –PPE Policy.

Transportation Maintenance Worker E8

Two years of experience equivalent to a Transportation Maintenance Worker, including one year equivalent to a Transportation Maintenance Worker 7; or, one year of skilled trades experience at the E9 level.
