Their duties and tasks are performed in temporary office facilities provided by the financial institution being examined and include considerable sitting, occasional standing and walking, limited lifting, periodic microcomputer usage and normal office routines. Position requires daily in-state travel by automobile and out-of-state travel usually by air. Overnight travel is required.
